

Easton's Open Spaces, Natural and Historic Sites

① **Paine Open Space**

129 acres with horse and pedestrian trails through open fields and woods. One of the ponds even boasts a beaver dam.

② **Poindexter Nature Preserve**

40 acres offering lovely walks through fields and pine forests, with a fantastic old natural stone dam and crossings over the Mill River.

④ **Jump Hill Preserve**

117 acres with 2.6 miles of trails. Walk the land just the way the glaciers left it, but with trees, of course!

③ **Abbey Lane Fishing Pond**

Bring your kids to this ideal spot to teach them how to fish! The two acre pond is home to sunfish and some small bass.

⑦ **Samuel Senior Memorial Park**

Children and adults alike will enjoy wandering along the boardwalk nature trails that run through 11 lovely acres of wetland and woods.

⑤ **Trout Brook Valley**

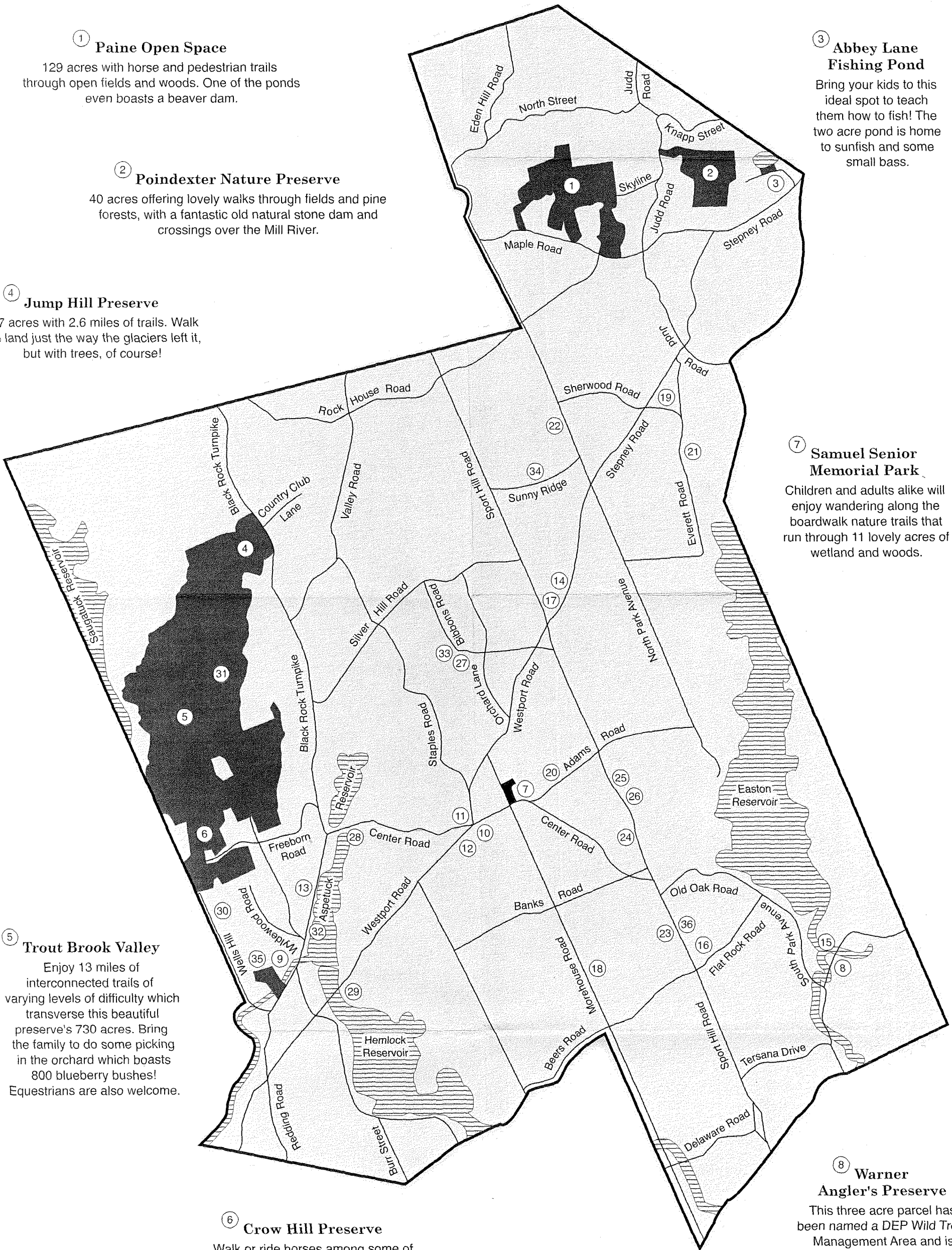
Enjoy 13 miles of interconnected trails of varying levels of difficulty which transverse this beautiful preserve's 730 acres. Bring the family to do some picking in the orchard which boasts 800 blueberry bushes! Equestrians are also welcome.

⑥ **Crow Hill Preserve**

Walk or ride horses among some of Connecticut's fine old stone walls as you explore 3.8 miles of trails through 162 acres of reforested farm fields.

⑧ **Warner Angler's Preserve**

This three acre parcel has been named a DEP Wild Trout Management Area and is home to populations of natural brown and rainbow trout. Come and enjoy some great catch and release fly fishing with barbless hooks.
