## MINUTES FOR THE TOWN OF EASTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION EASTON TOWN HALL CONFERENCE ROOM A November 26th, 2019 7:30 p.m.

Chair Dori Wollen called the meeting called to order at 7:31 p.m. Steve Montgomery was appointed to vote for Sarah Cwikla.

1.) #19-559- received 8/27/2019 + 65 days = 10/31/2019 + 65 days = 01/04/2020- Lot 6 Tatetuck Trail - Nagy Enterprises, Inc.- Construct new house and driveway. Norman Nagy and Donna Nagy-Burzynski appeared on behalf of this application. Following another site walk to confirm the location of the pedestrian easement, Commissioners confirmed that the driveway, as constructed, overlaps the pedestrian easement up to elevation 396/394 and thus does not conform to the original plans as approved by P&Z in 2001. This issue is being referred back to P&Z for their further consideration. All other conditions of the permit request having been satisfactorily resolved, a MOTION was made by Elliot Leonard to approve #19-559 with standard stipulations and the following additional conditions: 1) the silt fence shown on the October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2001 plans is the approved limit of disturbance, 2) a line of boulders are to be installed directly east of the silt fence and adjacent to the 100% reserve area to serve as a permanent demarcation and indicator of the limit of disturbance. The drip line of the two large oak trees will be protected permanently either by the line of boulders, or if outside the line of boulders, then protected temporarily by a fence during construction. 3.) The placement of the Pedestrian Easement is being returned to Planning and Zoning for their determination because the easement as currently shown overlaps the driveway up to elevation 396/394. Steve Montgomery seconded the motion. VOTE: This item was approved by unanimous voice vote.
