MINUTES FOR THE TOWN OF EASTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION SPECIAL MEETING - EASTON TOWN HALL CONFERENCE ROOM A THURSDAY, March 28, 2017 8:00 p.m.

1. Meeting called to order at 7:30 p.m.

2. INLAND/WETLAND APPLICATIONS:

- A. I/W #17-521 25 North Street Salma Residence pond cleaning 1/24/17 + 65 days = 3/30/2017. Homeowners were not present, however some members of the Commission had walked the site. A motion was made by Catherine Alfandre to approve the application and seconded by Elliot Leonard. - Standard conditions apply.
- B. #17-522 355 Sport Hill Road Tom Sherwood was not present at the meeting. The Commission is trying to find a previous map of the wetlands prior to making a decision.
- C. #17-523 15 Newman Drive, Mario Capela, agent and Fred D'Amico (engineer) were present new residence. Mr. Capela presented the application; he has an option to buy the property subject to receiving a permit to construct a house and a pool at the site. A revised plan was submitted and the property had been staked. Members of the Commission had walked the site. Steve Corti made a motion to approve the application with regular stipulations as well as preserving as much of the stone walls as possible, seconded by Elliot Leonard, all in favor.

Owner was present, he would like to put in an above ground pool. The Commission will walk the site and requested he have the pool location staked.

Dori Wollen prepared an analysis of P&Z's approval of the Saddle Ridge permit application with an emphasis why Conservation/Inland Wetland should have been involved in the permitting process. It was clear that P&Z usurped this Commission's statutory authority yet expecting to take responsibility for enforcement. Steve Corti moved and Steve Hume seconded a motion to discuss our options with First Selectman Adam Dunsby regarding possibly filing an appeal re the Planning and Zoning approval. An appeal has to be filed by April 7th. Dori Wollen will make an appointment with Adam.
