# Easton Energy & Environment Task Force

Regular meeting, Wednesday, January 19, 2022

Remote meeting via zoom, 7:30 p.m.

Cathy convened the meeting at 7:37

### **Minutes**

Briefly discussed. Katie motioned to approve; Lise seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

#### Solar data

Production for November was 0; December was 93% of expectation for Phase I; January is currently looking good; Cathy reported that overall for 2021 the production was very good, esp considering the system was down for 6 weeks at the end of 21

For Phase I, Green Bank has a weather normalized number; Skyview doesn't do this for Phase II; (93% for Phase I vs. 64% for Phase II)

Cathy and Bobby have a meeting next week with Scott Petruzzelli (the new Director of Finance and Operations) and the new assistant, who helps manage the solar data for the spreadsheet; will share info from spreadsheets

Bobby added that we have not had a non-cost savings month since July 2019
Cathy reached out to the Green Bank to inquire about the contract to ask what happens when the system is down; she discovered 1 month where we were billed and has inquired for clarification (supposed to pay only when the system generates power)

### EV Readiness team/next steps

Katie: spoke to Westport police Chief Foti Koskinas; they have had over 1000 requests for information about their EV program from other police organizations around the country and even internationally; Katie then spoke with Chief Doyle to help coordinate a date for Westport to come and talk to the Easton police department; Katie asked to attend the meeting; she also reached out to Ed and Jenna at Public Works to alert them; as of this meeting, no date has been set, but things are moving forward to get the 2 parties together (Katie also mentioned that Easton's police cars are repaired and tuned in Westport, at their facility); Katie reported that Koskinas said the savings with EV were incredible, and that they have a Tesla as well

Katie met with someone in Bridgeport who is interested in electric school buses.

Cathy is following up with LiveGreen (Daphne Dixon's group) about the EV Readiness program.

## Recycling grant timeline/next steps

Cathy reminded the group that the subcommittee will meet soon to come up with a plan and timeline for implementation for the grant

### Discussed:

- doing early publicity to make town residents aware of the stickers
- ideas for wording and graphics of the stickers
- the message(s) we want to convey in articles
  - cost savings to the town when recycling issues are fixed
  - keep message simple and highlight the most important problems to fix
  - deal with common recycling myths (wish-cycling)

Ed shared main points from monthly meetings with recycling partners (Oakridge and other facilities, waste haulers, Public Works and Town Managers from around CT); their conversations center on costs, where the markets are going, what current problems exist and the Bottle Bill most recently

He shared information on recycling costs to local area towns; reported on important topics:

- Items under 2" are not recyclable (includes bottle caps)
- Glass: Ed confirmed that it's mostly ground up and transported (issues: little to no use for recycled glass and contamination);
- Paper and cardboard recycling up due to Covid-related online sales (packaging)
- How recycling is failing to perform as once hoped

## CT Energy Network zoom meeting recap

Recap of the meeting: mostly about goals for 2022, Path to 100 (100% renewable energy for CT); requests for sharing information on social media to increase our audience (networking, social media tools and strategies); requests for task forces to share actions they are doing to expand reach and cooperate with local towns, share information

#### Other points:

- Dedicated point person in local government helpful to have
- Resources on informative links, slides, solar, EV all on the site (updated)
- Path to 100 book provides support and information for initiatives

### Other items 2022/ideas

Email from Wilton Go Green briefly discussed: Wilton has plans to create a comprehensive list of places to recycle and/or donate items for reuse; attached a copy of a guide for New Haven County as an example; briefly discussed sharing and/or using this for our town site

Task Force list of ideas/priorities for 2022:

- 1. EV readiness
- Solar: increase awareness and interest.

- 3. Recycling: inform, correct myths, do better
- 4. Waste Stream reduction (through recycling and composting initiatives)
- 5. Education of public and schools
- 6. Composting outreach

Discussion followed about a new Barlow student who would like to attend our meetings; she might be able to write informational articles to submit to The Courier. Will circle back at next month's meeting.

Bobby made a motion to adjourn; Heidi seconded. Cathy adjourned the meeting at 9:25 p.m.
