  - a. Todd Johnston was elected as Chairperson
     Motion to Approve: (Lewis) approved unanimously
  - b. New Technologies at JBHS. The following were discussed.
    - Apple TV when hooked up to a projector, students can request action (directed by teacher) and work can be projected. Quicker switch from computer to computer. IOS, Android, Tablet and PCS -- Next generation Apple TV can do this. Glitches being worked out.
    - Google -- Interface with Google Apps for education. Growing rapidly.
       Google classroom could eventually replace Edline (2-3 years?).
    - Chromebooks -- inexpensive student units (\$250) agnostic platform. maintenance -efficient to wipe and reinstall.
    - Google Expedition Jackie Whiting cardboard viewers.
    - SAMR

**Substitution** - technology offers a simple change of format (still teacher-centric)

**Augmentation** - technology is built into existing lessons (leaning toward student-centric)

**Modification** - technology is used to create a significant functional change

**Redefinition** - technology exists as a support for student centered learning

- Refresh for staff computers 1% of budget locked in hardware.
- Student owned equipment (student owned device initiative)- building in supports
- GRANT: Peggy \$20,000 grant applied for (½ to enhance wireless)- still in limbo
- Refresh time schedule- Chris Angell will begin refresh research (SmartBoards, LCD projectors, staff laptops, classroom workstations, and ancillaries)
- Tech Fair to offer computers Time, place, and details TBD
- Tech fair could increase participation of student owned device initiative and reduce the reliance on labs (currently 70% usage), decreasing district costs and opening up teaching space, but training/PD will be needed
- Community Assets Network was presented and approved.
- c. The Technology Plan was presented by Chris Angell. It was discussed that our technology goals align with where we are heading.
