
BALLOT QUESTION


As an advisory question, should the Town of Easton appropriate \$249,400 for the local match requirement (20% of the total cost of \$1,247,000) for the costs associated with constructing a multi-use/pedestrian path along Sport Hill Road from the entrance of Helen Keller Middle School to the crosswalk at Silverman's Farm pursuant to the Town's "transportation alternatives setaside" application submitted to the Connecticut Department of Transportation on August 29, 2019?

PROPOSAL

- Driveway of HKMS to Silverman's crosswalk
- Provide off-road use for pedestrians, cyclists, strollers, wheelchairs
- Purpose is to provide a safe thoroughfare for users and protection from high-speed traffic on the road
- Pathway would be 8-10 feet wide, constructed of asphalt with a 2-4 foot grass shoulder on both sides from the HKMS driveway to the Easton Village Store driveway
- Easton Village Store to the crosswalk at Silverman's Farm would be 6-ft wide concrete path
- Right-of-way provides sufficient space to construct the pathway without the need to take people's personal property



PROPOSAL

- Consideration of "back way" behind Vets Field
 - Crosses wetlands, water company property, private property, reduced shoulder on Old Oak Rd
 - Extensive construction needed
- Design process involved engineers, surveyors, consultants, community input
- Decided Sport Hill Rd path as preferred route



FUNDING

- Town applied for and received a grant through the Transportation Alternatives Program
 - Project ranked first among applicants from Bridgeport-Stamford Transportation Management Area (consists of 17 municipalities)
- Program provides federal transportation funds for 80% of project design and construction costs, administered through the state
- Town responsible for 20% of cost
 - Total projected cost \$1, 257,000
 - Easton portion \$249,400

PROCEDURE

- Question on the referendum is for advisory purposes
 - Placed on ballot by Board of Selectmen
 - Board of Finance voted 3-3 not to approve the special allocation of funds
- Approval does not guarantee execution
 - Board of Finance still needs to approve the special allocation of funds
