No appointment of alternates necessary. Art announces BOF Clerk Ira Kaplan will be Clerk for Joint Meeting.

1. (Agenda item #1) Presentation and discussion of the Fire and EMS System Analysis report by Emergency Services Consulting International (ESCI) (7:33)

Dave says no public comment is on the agenda, and the meeting purpose is the presentation of the report, and that no decisions or votes will be taken. Art offers remarks and invites Chris Truty to present.

Note: the Zoom connection was mostly successful, but spotty at times. On several occasions there was a short gap in the audio from Chris Truty, which will be evident in the recording. It is not a recording error, it was experienced at the meeting, but the gaps were short enough that we proceeded without interruption nor asking Chris to repeat himself.

Chris Truty introduces himself and co-consultant Shawn Morris, and presents slides (attached) summarizing ESCI report's findings and recommendations. Various Board members and guests ask questions and participate in discussion.

Chris Truty summarizes the collection of recommendations (8:25).

The presentation is completed and the floor is open for questions (8:41)

Andy expresses that the report is a public document, and should be accurate, even on portions that are not directly relevant to the conclusions and recommendations. Art advises that participants offering corrections to report should send them to Chris Calvert to collect and provide to ESCI.

Several participants ask questions and offer comments.



 Motion to adjourn BOS meeting by Kristi/Bob. Result: passes 3-0 at 9:41.



ADDITIONAL FIRE STATIONS VS. AUTOMATIC AID AGREEMENTS





