Board of Fire Commissioners Regular Meeting Minutes September 21st, 2022 Filed subject to approval

Attendance: D. Buchanan, D. Katz, J. Miranda, R. Cable, J. Yeotsas

Also in attendance: P Neary, R. Klem

The meeting was called to order at 7:38pm. Commissioner Buchanan moved to approve the June 2022 minutes. Commissioner Cable seconded. Minutes approved unanimously with no changes.

Chief Klem gave his report.

- There were 43 incidents in June, 40 incidents in July and 46 in August, projecting approximately 500 calls annually which is normal.
- The Barn in the training field adjacent to the Firehouse is almost completed. It will house fire
 equipment and materials for Carnival.
- The current budget is on track with anticipated spending and expenses.
- Engine 1 is due to be replaced within a few years. Given the dramatically increased cost of an engine
 and the expanded lead times for delivery, Chief Klem suggested recommending to the Town we
 order the engine sooner rather than waiting the two years.
- The Chief has still not heard back about the possible grant for the SCBA replacement, but it appears we may hear in October. In case the EFD does not get the grant, the town has allocated \$180,000 to replace the tanks so the Chief recommended we begin the process in the October/November time frame as there is an 8–12-week delivery time for the tanks.
- The Chief met with the First Selectman regarding the Easton Village Store soil contamination issue.
 The wells used by the EFD have been tested twice with no contamination evident in the tests. There is a well in the middle of the Green with water that is not drinkable, but it is not used.
- Given the high cost to mitigate the dry hydrants in the northern part of town, the Chief might recommend the town purchase a tanker in place of the dry hydrant repair costs.
- There are six new EVFD members on probation.

The Fire Marshall gave his report (attached). Because of the recent rainfall there is no prohibition on burning.

There was no new business to discuss.

Commissioner Katz moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:19 PM. Commissioner Cable seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.
