Dave Bindelglass called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Present: Dave Bindelglass, Robert Lessler, Kristi Sogofsky

- 1. Kristi Sogofsky moved to approve the minutes of the Board of Selectmen meeting, February 2, 2023 as amended. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Robert Lessler moved to approve the amendment to the special joint meeting minutes with Board of Finance, January 17, 2023. Kristi Sogofsky seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 3. During public comment, several residents shared on the Board of Ethics complaint, the suspension of the Planning & Zoning Commission chair, protecting the watershed, the Affordable Housing Committee, EVS and South Park.
- 4. Kristi Sogofsky moved to approve the following tax refunds as recommended by Krista Kot, Tax Collector. 1. THOMAS LINLEY-\$167.43. 2. THOMAS LINLEY-\$86.77. 3. HONDA LEASE TRUST-\$238.09. 4. JUSTIN & DEVON WIBLE-\$6,260.45. 5. DEVON WIBLE-\$85.23. 6. NEWTOWN SAVINGS BANK-\$816.66. 7. SUZANNE GOLD-\$641.46. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Dave Bindelglass moved to accept the resignation of Jean Stetz-Puchalski from the Agricultural Commission. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Dave Bindelglass moved to accept the resignation of Lori Dougall-Cochran from the Agricultural Commission. Kristi Sogofsky seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Kristi Sogofsky moved to appoint Jacob Conover from alternate to member for the Agricultural Commission for a term ending 1/2/24. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Robert Lessler moved to appoint Michael Cordover from alternate to member for the Easton Diversity & Inclusion Task Force for a term ending 1/2/25. Kristi Sogofsky seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 6. Dave Bindelglass moved to approve flying the Pride flag for the month of June 2024. Kristi Sogofsky seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 7. Ray Martin, and a legal decision he was involved in was discussed. The Board of Ethics did a review of this case prior to their initial discussions with Mr. Martin and those filing complaints. They recommended suspending Mr. Martin prior to completing their review. Dave explained that a review of all relevant ordinances by our town attorney concluded that there was no ability by the First Selectman or the Board of Selectmen to suspend a board or commission chair. We will await a final recommendation to the Board of Selectmen by the Board of Ethics.

- 8. Kristi Sogofsky moved to approve the Building Department Secretary job description as amended. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
 - 8a. Kristi Sogofsky moved to add to the agenda the discussion and possible action for nonunion town employees to receive a 3% base increase to annual wages for FY24. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
 - Robert Lessler moved to approve the 3% base increase to annual wages for FY24 for non-union town employees as recommended by the First Selectman and Director of Finance. Kristi Sogofsky seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- 9. During public comment, several residents shared their objection to not suspending the Planning & Zoning Commission chair due to the language in the Ethics ordinance. Others spoke about protecting the watershed, and one resident disagreed with the 3% increase for non-union town employees and flying the Pride flag for a month, suggesting a week instead.
- 10. The Board discussed the need to update the Ethics Ordinance. There was also discussion about protecting the watershed and the proposed legislation that towns greater than 70% watershed be exempted from the appeals process for 8-30g housing developments. The Planning & Zoning Commission will review the Easton Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD) at their upcoming meeting on March 13th at 7:00 p.m. Dave stated he met virtually with the people from Ukraine Aid International to begin working on a relationship with a town in northern Ukraine which is very similar to Easton called Suyvatohorsk. Dave is looking at ways to show our solidarity with these incredibly brave folks and their children.
- 11. Kristi Sogofsky moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 p.m. Robert Lessler seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
