Kip Kolesinskas's recent work involved efforts to improve land access and affordability, and provide technical services to new and beginning farmers. He serves on the UConn Extension Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program, Solid Ground Farmer Training cadre, where he provides training & site assessments on land access, soil health & climate change adaptation strategies. He also works on the National initiatives Farms Under Threat and Farmland For The Next Generation.

Lily Orr grew up on her family's dairy farm in Thompson, CT, which is part of milk cooperatives like Cabot and The Farmer's Cow. After graduating college, she worked for the Town of York Parks and Recreation managing trails and land at Mount Agamenticus in Maine. She is now a Conservation Associate at CT Farmland Trust where she assists with easement acquisitions, stewardship functions, and manages the Connecticut FarmLink website, which helps to connect farmland owners with farmland seekers.
