"ICE" YOUR PHONE: ICE – 'In case of Emergency' – (Quoted from an email) "Many of us carry our mobile phones with names and numbers stored in its memory - but nobody, other than ourselves, knows which of these numbers belong to our closest family or friends. All you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name, 'ICE' (In Case of Emergency). The idea was thought up by a paramedic, who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which number to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there were a nationally recognized name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, EMT's and

hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number(s) you have stored as 'ICE'.

For more than one contact name – simply enter ICE 1, ICE 2, and ICE 3, etc. (What a great idea this paramedic had)! Let's spread the concept of ICE by storing an ICE number, (2 are better), in our Mobile phones today! ICE will speak for us when we are not able to". Do you have new information that I could pass on? Please let me know!

## **Proper Disposal Of Prescription Drugs – DEPA guidelines:**

- 1) Remove prescription drugs from their original containers.
- 2) Combine prescriptions with an undesirable substance like kitty litter or used coffee grounds.
- 3) Seal in a non-descript container.
- 3) Throw container with mixture into the trash to be incinerated at the local dump. (Do not flush down the toilet due to adding toxins to the environment).

CVS offers a mail envelope to discard medicines for a minimal fee. The important thing is to remember not to flush medicines down the toilet due to adding toxins to the environment. Check with your personal pharmacist and drug store, too.

# THE FILE OF LIFE: HAS LIFE SAVING INFORMATION WHICH EXTREMELY HELPFUL IS WHEN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

**RESPOND**. The kits provide a list of your medical conditions and medications which can speed treatment in an emergency both in the ambulance and at the hospital. The "file" also provides emergency contact numbers to call. Each File of Life kit includes:

- A large magnetic holder for medical information to be placed on your refrigerator
- A smaller card and holder to keep with you at all times
