ABSENTEE BALLOT ADDITIONAL HOURS BY APPOINTMENT

Please contact the Town Clerk's office at (203) 268-6291 or email townclerk@eastonct.gov to make arrangements for after-hours absentee applications and ballots. I will make every effort to accommodate your request to meet after-hours for an absentee ballot.

Absentee balloting is available for those individuals who cannot vote in person for one of the following reasons: active service in the armed forces; absence from town during all hours of the election; physical disability; illness; or religious tenets. An application must first be completed, and then the ballot can be issued to the applicant in person or mailed to the address indicated on the application. A voter may apply in person for an absentee ballot at the Town Clerk's Office, and vote at that time. A ballot cannot be issued in person to anyone other than the applicant. An application for absentee ballot may also be mailed to an applicant upon request. Absentee ballot application may be downloaded from www.eastonct.gov.

Absentee ballots are available at the Town Clerk's office during regular business hours: Monday -Friday 8:30am – 4:30pm (closed 1:00-2:00pm).

Completed, dated and signed applications should be sent to: Town of Easton, Attn: Town Clerk, 225 Center Road, Easton, CT 06612. Upon receipt of the completed application, your absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

All ballots MUST be received by the Town Clerk by November 5th at 8:00pm.

Pursuant to Public Act No. 12-57, if you are an elector who is permanently disabled, you may quality for **Permanent Absentee Ballot Status**. Please contact our office to inquire about specifics of eligibility.
